World Affairs Course Outline (Advanced Course) 2021-2022

Course Description

This course is designed to help students explore and gain an understanding of broad and ever-changing news topics of social concerns and issues. Emphasis will be placed on increasing vocabulary and in-class listening activities. Students will be given opportunities to research information related to the topic and express their opinions in pair/group discussions and short presentations throughout the course.
